TN parties oppose 3-language policy

Chennai: On January 23, 1968, as the anti-Hindi agitations raged across Tamil Nadu, the C N Annadurai-led DMK government sat for a second meeting of the second session of the legislative assembly. Education and industries minister V R Nedunchezhiyan moved a resolution in the House, in the wake of the "serious situation" triggered by the Union government's Official Languages (Amendment) Act, 1967.

The House resolved "that the three-language formula shall be scrapped, and that Tamil and English alone shall be

taught, and Hindi shall be eliminated altogether from the curriculum in all the schools in Tamil Nadu". Political parties in the state, including Dravidian giants DMK and AIADMK, have now come together to oppose the three-language formula promoted by the NEP. CM Palaniswami on Monday urged the PM to reconsider it. "It will never be allowed in Tamil Nadu. The people of the state have been firm in the two-language policy for eight decades," he said.

DMK chief MK Stalin was quick to thank the CM on Twitter for his stand. TNN
