Bengaluru: A shocker for Congress, which believed the worst was over in the recent 'house-trading' crisis, one of the 'missing' MLAs sent his resignation to CM Kamal Nath and speaker N P Tripathi on Thursday. It now heightens the suspense surrounding the three other missing legislators — two from Congress and one Independent.

Hardeep Singh Dang, legislator from Suwasra assembly seat in Mandasaur, has written that he is upset because he was not made a minister and his constituency "neglected" by the government.

CM Kamal Nath said: "Dang is an M.L.A. of our party I have received news of his resignation. But I have still not received any letter, nor has he discussed this issue with me personally, or met me. Till the time I do not have

Bengaluru: Amid reports of BJP's efforts to topple the Kamal Nath government, at least 10 Congress MLAs from Madhya Pradesh are reportedly holed up in various villas located along the Sarjapur-Whitefield tech corridor.
