By choosing 2 grassroots workers, BJP signals against dynasty politics

Bengaluru: By announcing two grassroots-level workers-Eranna Kadadi and Ashok Gasti - as candidates for the June 19 Rajya Sabha polls, the BJP national leadership has recognised loyalty, giving a thumbs down to dynasty politics. The decision has shattered hopes of many politicians' relatives aspiring for positions in the party and the government.

What appeared to be a sureshot ticket for incumbent Prabhakar Kore and former MP Ramesh Katti, the two powerful Lingayat leaders from Belagavi, has been turned on its head with the leadership choosing the new faces. It's now being deliberated why the BJP decided to overlook Kore and Katti against two low-profile district-level leaders. While Ramesh is the younger brother of Umesh V Katti, a senior BJP MLA representing Hukkeri in Belagavi, Kore heads the Karnataka Lingavat Education Society.

Sources said BL Santosh, the party's national secretary (organisation), had impressed upon the leadership in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls to choose Yuva Morcha leader Tejasvi Surya, 28, to contest from Bengaluru South, by denying a ticket to Tejaswini, wife of late Union minister Ananth Kumar. Similarly, Santosh has now ensured tickets to loyal footsoldiers, who are staunch supporters of deputy chief minister Laxman Savadi, incating his clout in the party.

BJP does not believe in dynasty rule, unlike its opponents, which have chosen to send HD Deve Gowda and Mallikarjun Kharge to the house of elders. Senior leaders insist it is a long-term strategy to end dynasty poli-tics and recognise loyal workers. "We're not saying there is no dynasty politics in BJP, but we're happy at least our party recognises it as a serious ailment and is making attempts to find a cure," said an MLA from Kalyana Karnataka region.

Since the 2018 assembly polls, the leadership has refrained from choosing candidates on the basis of family relations, barring a few exceptions like chief minister BS Yediyurappa, whose elder son is an LS member from Shivamogga younger son BY Vijayendra is state general secretary of the party's student wing. Sources claim BJP has been trying to turn the state unit into a pro-Hindu party rather than Lingayat-centric by appointing deputy CMs from different caste groups and picking RS candidate from backward castes like Sa-

All 4 RS candidates set to be elected unopposed

Bengaluru: With nomination papers of four candidates, including former Prime Minister, HD, Deve Gowda and veteran Congress leader Mallikarjun Kharge, declared valid, the Rajya Sabha election in Karnataka is set to be a unanimous affair.
