MPs support salary cut bill; slam curb on MPLADS

Scrap Central Vista project: Supriya Sule to Govt

ok Sabha members on Tuesday passed a Bill effecting a 30% cut in their salaries to enable the government meet exigencies due to the Covid-19 pandemic, but grudgingly accepted the scrapping of local area development funds for two

The Salary, Allowances and Pension of Members of Parliament (Amendment) Bill was passed unanimously by a voice vote, with members cutting across party lines expressing willingness to forgo he'r ati esalary for one year out ha le a strong 1 ca The restoration of the M. A. Stands.

The Bill seeks .) replace an ordinance promulgated during the inter-session period. The government had promulgated the Salary, Allowances and Pension of Members of Parliament (Amendment) Ordinance on April 7. In a ion Cabinet, the government and 7.5% for ST.

had suspended MPLADS fund for two years.

"The government can take away the entire salary, but restore the MPLADS fund." Trinamool member Sougata Ray said participating in the debate on the Bill.

NCP member Supriya Sule wanted the government to scrap the Rs 20,000 crore project to redevelop the Central Vista and build a new Parliament building.

"You can take a vote here. Do you want a Central Vista and an office or do you want a hospital or a school in your constituency? I think it is a given, it is not rocket science," Sule said making a strong pitch for the restoration of the MPLADS fund.

Under the MPLADS fund, every Member of Parliament gets to allocate Rs five crore for development projects in his constituency every tear. These funds are spent er smuller projects on as at lding a culter, cancying r bulances and outering a classroom.

"Almost 80% of the fund is spent in rural areas; why are you taking away the funds meant to be spent on Scheduled Castes," Congress leader Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury said pointing out that 15% of separate decision of the Un-the fund was reserved for SC
