Cases breach 10,000 mark in Karnataka

He also said various projections had shown the transmission of the current variant of COVID-19 would be faster. "Along with this, people have let their guard down and are attending mass gatherings such as weddings, rallies, and processions. This is also responsible for the huge jump," he said. The positivity rate for Sunday stood at 7.72 % and the case fatality rate stood at 0.39 %. The total number of COVID-19 positive cases stood at 10.65 lakh.

The number of COVID-19 related deaths reported on Sunday was 40, taking the total number to 12,889 in the State.

Meanwhile, 2,638 patients were discharged on Sunday, taking the total number of discharges to 9.83 lakh. Of the 69,225 active cases in the State, as many as 440 patients are admitted in ICUs across designated hospitals.

On Sunday, as many as 70,000 people were vaccinated, taking the total number of people who have been vaccinated in the State to 58.51 lakh.

Cases breach 10,000 mark in State

After several months, the number of COVID-19 cases reported in Karnataka crossed the 10,000 mark. On Sunday, as many as 10,250 new COVID 19 cases were reported in the State. Of these, as many as 7,584 cases were in Bengaluru Urban alone.

The last time the number of cases crossed the 10,000 mark was on October 10, 2020. The cases reported on Sunday is a huge jump compared to Saturday, when the number of cases reported stood at 6,955. However, the number of tests conducted on Saturday, which is reflected in Sunday's data, stood at 1.32 lakh. On Friday it was below 1 lakh. TAC member C.N. Manjunath said this was the biggest jump in a single day since the pandemic began in Karnataka.
