No exams for class 1 to 9 in state board

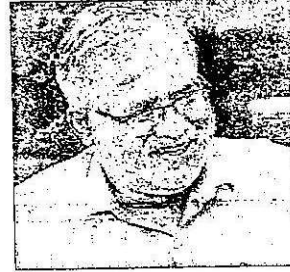
Putting an end to speculation, the state government on Tuesday decided to promote children from class 1 to 9 in schools affiliated to the state board to the next class without annual examinations in view of the worsening Covid-19 situation.

The promotion will be based on the Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE), which was conducted through online and physical mode as well as the Vidyagama programme. The decision was taken at a high-level meeting chaired by Primary and Secondary Education Minister S Suresh Kumar in Bengaluru on Tuesday, where officials of the department were present.

Schools must conduct the assessment based on CCE and announce results by April 30. "Evaluation and the result announcement must be a tool only for assessing the learning capabilities of the children. In case of lesser learning outcomes, the same should be addressed as part of a bridge course during commencement of the next academic year," Suresh Kumar said.

The minister clarified that there will be no changes in the SSLC examination schedule. The exams will be held between June 21 and July 5.

academicians as well as the Karnataka State Primary School Teachers' Association. D Shashi Kumar, general secretary of the Associated Management of Primary and Secondary Schools in Karnataka, requested the government to "allow schools to conduct at least online-based assessment".
